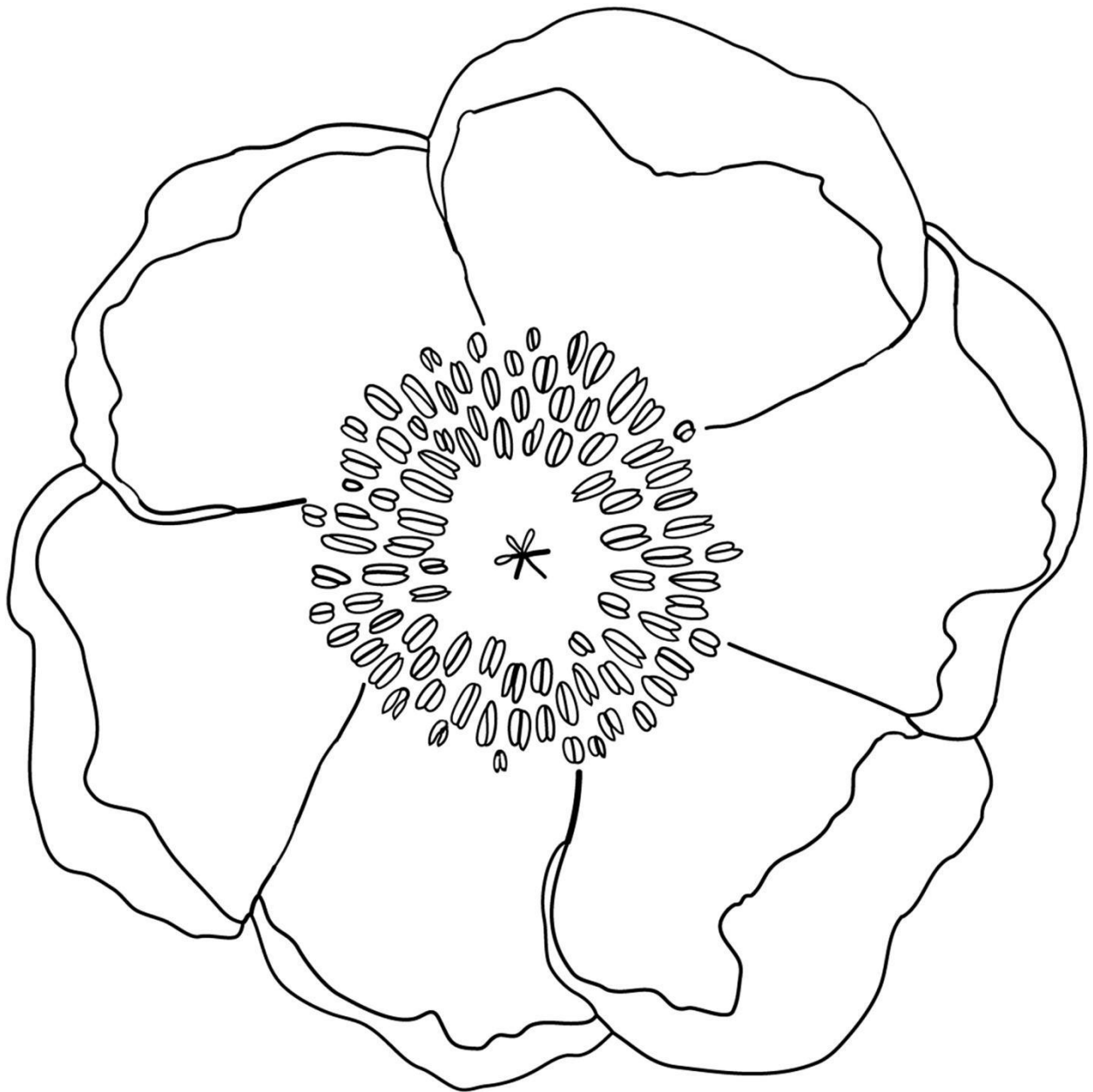


CHURCH OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD WITH ST. PETER, LEE
